

# Picante Wrap

## CROCHET PATTERN

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Oversized wraps are everywhere now and the Picante Wrap is everything you need and more - it's effortlessly stylish with drape and lace, it's warm, cosy and comfy with worsted wool and you can wear it with anything to complete an outfit.

## Recommended Yarn

#### Tension

Cascade Superwash 220 100% Wool, 200m, 219yds / 100g

5 balls (approx 900m) of Blaze

Work 18sts and 8 rows in the set pattern repeat to measure 10  $\times$  10cm/4  $\times$  4in using 4mm hook, or size required to obtain tension.

#### Hook

#### Sizes

A 5mm/H <u>crochet hook</u> or hook needed to meet gauge

One size fits all - 64cm by 130cm.

### **Difficulty**

Easy



#### Other Materials and Tools

Scissors
Tapestry needle
3 buttons of your choice



### Glossary

ch(s) - chain(s)

sp - space

ss - slip stitch

RS - right side

WS - wrong side

sk - skip

rep - repeat

flo - front loop only

blo - back loop only

#### Yarn Alternatives

Choosing yarn is so important (and fun!) but I know it's great to have options depending on your budget, here are some great alternatives I've found. Whatever yarn you choose, just make sure to check your gauge before starting your project as they will all be slightly different.

1.

#### Swish by WeCrochet

100% Superwash Merino Wool 110yds, 100m / 50g.

2.

#### Sirdar Country Classic

50% Wool, 50% Acrylic, 218yds, 200m / 100g

3.

#### Heatherly by WeCrochet

80% Acrylic, 20% Merino Wool, 218yds, 200m / 100g

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#### Notes

The wrap is worked as a rectangle in rows.

Turn your work after each row.

A chl at the beginning of a row does not count as a stitch.

A ch3 at the beginning of a row counts as a stitch.

Once your rectangle is complete, secure your desired buttons in place and wear as shown.

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#### **Picante Wrap**

**UK Terminology** 

Make one panel as follows.

Foundation chain: ch248. (multiple of 12+8)

Row 1 (RS): dc in 2nd and each ch across [247]

Row 2: ch1, dc in flo of each across

Row 3: ch1, dc in blo of each across

Row 4: Repeat Row 2 Row 5: Repeat Row 3 Row 6: Repeat Row 2

Row 7: ch3 (counts as st), tr in 2, 3tr in next, \*skip 2, dc in next, ch5, skip 5, dc in next, skip 2^, 5tr in next, repeat from \* across ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, 3tr in next, tr in last 3.

Row 8: ch1, dc in flo of 4, \*ch5, dc in next ch-5sp, ch5^, dc in 3rd st of next 5tr group, repeat from \* across, ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, dc in flo of last 4.

Row 9: ch3 (counts as st), tr in blo of 3, \*dc in next ch-5sp, 5tr in next dc, dc in next ch-5sp^, ch5, repeat from \* across, ending last time at ^, ch2, tr in blo of last 4.

Row 10: ch1, dc in flo of 4, \*ch5, dc in 3rd st of next 5tr group, ch5, dc in next ch-5sp, repeat from \* across to last 5tr group, ch5, dc in flo of next 4.

Row 11: ch3 (counts as st), tr in blo of 2, 3tr in next, \*dc in next ch-5sp, ch5, dc in next ch-5sp^, 5tr in next dc, repeat from \* across ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, 3tr in next, tr in blo of last 3.

Row 12: Repeat Row 8
Row 13: Repeat Row 9
Row 14: Repeat Row 10
Row 15: Repeat Row 3

Row 16: Repeat Row 2 Row 17: Repeat Row 3 Row 18: Repeat Row 2

Rows 7-18 create the pattern.

Rows 19-65: Repeat the pattern 4 more times (ending at Row 65: Repeat Row 17)

Row 66: ch1, dc in flo of 32, ch6, skip 6, dc in flo of 32, ch6, skip 6, dc in flo of each to end (this row creates the buttonholes).

Row 67: Repeat Row 3 Row 68: Repeat Row 2

Line the wrap up and sew the buttons on to the correct position on the right side of wrap.

Block the wrap and weave in all ends to finish.









#### **Picante Wrap**

**US Terminology** 

Make one panel as follows.

Foundation chain: ch248. (multiple of 12+8)

Row 1 (RS): sc in 2nd and each ch across [247]

Row 2: ch1, sc in flo of each across

Row 3: ch1, sc in blo of each across

Row 4: Repeat Row 2 Row 5: Repeat Row 3 Row 6: Repeat Row 2

Row 7: ch3 (counts as st), dc in 2, 3dc in next, \*skip 2, sc in next, ch5, skip 5, sc in next, skip 2^, 5dc in next, repeat from \* across ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, 3dc in next, dc in last 3.

Row 8: ch1, sc in flo of 4, \*ch5, sc in next ch-5sp, ch5^, sc in 3rd st of next 5tr group, repeat from \* across, ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, sc in flo of last 4.

Row 9: ch3 (counts as st), dc in blo of 3, \*sc in next ch-5sp, 5dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5sp^, ch5, repeat from \* across, ending last time at ^, ch2, dc in blo of last 4.

Row 10: ch1, sc in flo of 4, \*ch5, sc in 3rd st of next 5dc group, ch5, sc in next ch-5sp, repeat from \* across to last 5dc group, ch5, sc in flo of next 4.

Row 11: ch3 (counts as st), dc in blo of 2, 3dc in next, \*sc in next ch-5sp, ch5, sc in next ch-5sp^, 5dc in next sc, repeat from \* across ending last time at ^ 4 sts from end, 3dc in next, dc in blo of last 3.

Row 12: Repeat Row 8
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Line the wrap up and sew the buttons on to the correct position on the right side of wrap.

Block the wrap and weave in all ends to finish.
