# materials





# Yarn

#### **Color Theory**

Category #4 weight yarn, worsted. 246yds/100g.

Available from:

WeCrochet, and Lion Brand

Each bauble uses approx 20g of yarn (50yds) if you'd like to raid your stash!

For the whole collection of baubles I used the following colours:

3 balls of Ivory

1 ball each of Nutmeg, Canyon, Raisin, Satellite, Dijon, Caper, Stonewash and Thunder

This bauble uses 8 colours with Ivory as the background.



# Hook

A 2.75mm (C) crochet hook

My favourites are:

Clover Soft Touch

Furls Odyssey (use HANJAN15 to save 15%)



## Baubles

I used 8cm/3.15" plastic baubles available here in a pack of 24: Fillable plastic baubles

Alternatively, you could cover existing baubles that you have at home.

You could also use Fibre Fill to stuff them or scraps of yarn ends! You just need to make sure to stuff them really full to get a good shape.

Ribbon for hanging

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# Terms and Abbreviations

# CROCHET TECHNIQUE



# STITCHES

# TECHNIQUE

Fair Isle crochet uses beginner stitches in a really fun and unique way to create a knit look fabric. The only stitch you'll need to know for the Fair Isle section of the baubles is a split single crochet stitch (ssc). It's worked like a regular single crochet but 'splits' through the centre V of the stitch rather into the main body of the stitch as it's usually done.

The key to working Fair Isle crochet is knowing when and how to change colour. You can use any number of colours in the same round and either follow along using a chart or a written pattern to know when to change colour. When you need to work a stitch in a different colour you need to make sure to work the last 'yarn over and pull through' in the new colour to give really neat colour changes.

#### SPECIAL STITCHES

#### SINGLE CROCHET (sc)

Insert hook from front to back through stitch to be worked. Yarn over and pull through stitch. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook.

#### EXTENDED SINGLE CROCHET (Exsc)

Insert hook from front to back through stitch to be worked. Yarn over and pull through stitch. Yarn over and pull through 1 loop on the hook. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook.

#### SPLIT STITCH (split Exsc or split sc)

Work a stitch into the centre of the stitch to be worked. Insert your hook between the 'V' of the stitch (often referred to as the 'legs' of the stitch). Often also referred to as a waistcoat stitch.

# EXTENDED SINGLE CROCHET 2 TOGETHER (Exsc2tog) -

Insert hook from front to back through stitch to be worked. Yarn over and pull through stitch. Yarn over and pull through 1 loop on the hook. Insert hook from front to back through next stitch. Yarn over and pull through stitch. Yarn over and pull through 1 loop on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops on the hook.

#### GAUGE

Gauge isn't essential for this project - you just need to be happy with the fit if you're putting your covers over actual baubles.

I would suggest trying the cover on the bauble after Round 7 or 8 and if it's too big or too small to cover your chosen bauble then you can change your hook size to make it slightly bigger or smaller.

## PATTERN NOTES

The Fair Isle baubles are worked in continuous rounds with increases until Round 7, a set amount of 42 sts until Round 22 and then decreases until Round 27 to complete.

Always change yarn on the the last 'yarn over and pull through' when you need to change colour.

All stitches are worked as split stitches in the Fair Isle baubles.

Carrying your colours across the back of the work is a great idea! These are known as 'floats'. Make sure to catch your floats regularly in long sections that don't use that colour to avoid them pulling too tight.

#### CHART READING

Each chart shows all of the Rounds for the bauble from 1-27.

The light grey blocks in the charts do not represent stitches.

The other blocks relate to the colour of yarn used.

Rounds 1 - 6 and 23 - 27 are shown in the colour used and should follow the written increase and decrease pattern on pages 6 and 7.

Rounds 7 - 22 are the Fair Isle Section and should be read for colour changes from Right to Left for each Round.

#### WRITTEN PATTERN

#### **BASE**

Rounds 1 - 6 create the Base.

Work all stitches as split Exsc in this section.

You will find the colours to use in the charts and colour block instructions

from page 8 onwards.

The Fair Isle baubles are all worked in

the same way using the following

Round 1: 6 Exsc into the ring [6].

Round 2: 2 split Exsc into each stitch around [12].

Round 3: \* split Exsc in next st, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [18].

Round 4: \* split Exsc in next 2 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [24].

Round 5: \* split Exsc in next 3 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [30].

Round 6: \* split Exsc in next 4 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [36].

#### **FAIR ISLE SECTION**

Rounds 7 - 22 create the Fair Isle section. See page 8 for colour changes. Work all stitches as split sc in this section working colour changes in charts/colour blocks:

Round 7: ssc in next 5 sts, 2ssc in next st; rep from \* around [42].

Rounds 8 - 22: ssc in each st around.

#### WRITTEN PATTERN

TOP

Rounds 23 - 27 create the Top.

Work all stitches as split Exsc in this section.

Before making the Top, weave in ends and insert the bauble into the cover. Work the remaining rounds with the bauble in place. If your bauble has a removable cap then taking it off at this point could be helpful.

Round 23: \* split Exsc in next 5 sts, Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [36].

Round 24: \* split Exsc in next 4 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [30].

Round 25: \* split Exsc in next 3 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [24].

Round 26: \* split Exsc in next 2 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [18].

Round 27: \* split Exsc in next st, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [12].

#### INSERTING THE BAUBLE



pull the last loop so you don't lose your stitch



make sure all the ends are inside the cover



pop the bauble in (or stuff it if you are doing that)



adjust so that the bauble cover is neatly positioned

#### DECREASE ROUNDS

See page 10 for a tutorial on how to exsc2tog.

30 stitches



24 stitches



18 stitches

#### Note - the images show a different Fair Isle bauble being made from the collection but the process is exactly the same for each bauble.

#### FINISHING OFF



break yarn and pull through last stitch



weave end through last round



fasten off and pop end inside bauble



put cap on and add ribbon to hang


Technique: Fair Isle

Colours: A: Ivory, B: Dijon,

C: Satellite, D: Canyon,E: Caper, F: Thunder,G: Nutmeg, H: Raisin

## WRITTEN PATTERN Work as detailed in Fair Isle written pattern on page 6.

Note - the light grey blocks on the chart do not count as stitches, Rounds 1-6 and 23-27 are increase and decrease rounds.



# COLOUR BLOCKS

Work Rounds 1-6 and 23-27 in A following the Bottom and Top instructions on page 6 and 7. For Rounds 7-22 follow the colour blocks below working a split sc in each stitch around.

#### **BASE**

Work all stitches as split Exsc in this section using A.

Make a magic ring.

Round 1: 6 Exsc into the ring [6].

Round 2: 2 split Exsc into each stitch around [12].

Round 3: \* split Exsc in next st, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [18].

Round 4: \* split Exsc in next 2 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [24].

Round 5: \* split Exsc in next 3 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [30].

Round 6: \* split Exsc in next 4 sts, 2 split Exsc in next st; rep from \* around [36].

#### FAIR ISLE SECTION

Work all stitches as split sc in this section working colour changes as follows:

Round 7: (A) ssc in next 5 sts, 2ssc in next st; rep from \* around [42].

# WRITTEN COLOURS

#### TOP AND BOWS

Work all stitches as split Exsc in this section using A.

Before making the Top, weave in ends and insert the bauble into the cover. Work the remaining rounds with the bauble in place. If your bauble has a removable cap then taking it off at this point could be helpful.

If you would like to add bows to your bauble it is best to do this before making the top.

Use a small amount of Dijon (or the colour of your choice) to thread through the centre of the top of the present using a needle or small crochet hook. You need the yarn to have both ends facing the right side.

Tie the ends of the yarn into a neat bow as in the images.

Continue for Top now:

Round 23: \* split Exsc in next 5 sts, Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [36].

Round 24: \* split Exsc in next 4 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [30].

Round 25: \* split Exsc in next 3 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [24].

Round 26: \* split Exsc in next 2 sts, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [18].


Round 27: \* split Exsc in next st, split Exsc2tog over next 2 sts; rep from \* around [12].
